- Russ** (modern Russians, Belarussians and Ukrainians-Rusyns-Ruthenians): haplogroup R1a-Z280/M458 **from 40% to 60%**
- Western Slavs**: Lusitians Serbs of East Germany, Poles, Czechs and Slovaks - R1a-M458/Z280 - **from 30% to 70%**
- Southern Slavs**: Bulgarians and residents of the former Yugoslavia - R1a-M458/Z280 - **from 15% to 40%**
- Balts** (modern Lithuanians & Latvians) R1a-Z280 - **40%**

**Northern States of India** among brahmanas to **70%** - R1a-Z93/94, among Kshatriyas **30-40%** - R1a-Z93/94  
**Pakistanis & Nuristanis** R1a-Z93/94 **from 40% to 60%**
